Preparation of this accessibility statement

This statement was prepared on 11 September 2020. It was last reviewed on 23 September 2020.

This website was last tested on 11 September 2020. The test was carried out by Twenty-First Century Media Group using the WAVE Web Accessibility Evaluation Tool (<u>https://wave.webaim.org</u>). The test brought back the following results: 11 Errors, 0 Contrast, 26 Alerts.

All errors, colour contrast issues and alerts, will be fixed by 16 October 2020
